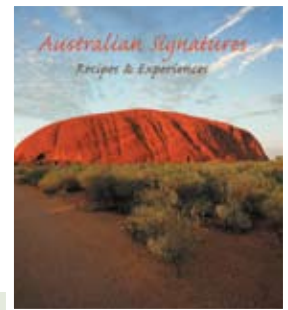
7. Salamanca Place

Experience Platypus House to observe live platypuses and echidnas in daylight and undercover! [www.platypushouse.com.au]

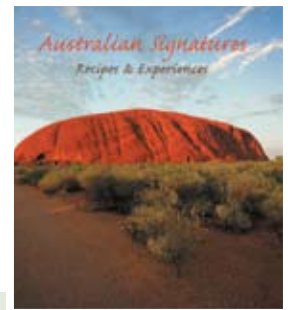
15. Lavender House & Tasmanian Lavender Fields
