1. Federation Square

Meander along Federation Square cultural precinct with its creative mix of attractions, restaurants, cafes, bars, function centres and over 2000 events held annually. [www.federationsquare.com.au]

2. Eureka Skydeck 88

Experience the Eureka Skydeck 88, with a switchable glass cube that slides out from the building known as “The Edge” on the 88th Floor Eureka Tower. [www.eurekaskydeck.com.au]

3. Old Melbourne Gaol

Visit Old Melbourne Gaol - Victoria’s oldest surviving prison and housed some of Victoria’s most hardened criminals including infamous outlaw Ned Kelly. [www.melbourne.com.au]

4. Scienceworks Museum

Visit the Scienceworks Museum that combines science and technology through a variety of ‘hands on’ exhibits, activities, tactile displays and highly interactive touring shows. [www.museumvictoria.com.au]

5. Otway Fly Tree Top Walk
